IMBA Canada Trail Audit Results

We were pleased to have the International Mountain Biking Association (IMBA) conduct an audit of the Hydrocut Trail network this past December. The audit was completed to evaluate how well our trails adhere to the IMBA trail building guidelines. The Hydrocut trails passed the audit with only a few recommendations for changes, including:

- Improved filters at the start of Adam's Run, Kamikaze and the Expert section of Sweet Street.** The new filters will be similar to that at the start of the Godzilla trail. The intent of these filters is to provide riders with an indication of the skill level required on the trail and to prevent riders without the necessary skills from inadvertently accessing them
- Re-routing of one of the Kamikaze trails.** Currently, the Expert and Blue lines on this trail crisscross each other which presents a potential safety concern. As such, we will be keeping the Expert line and building a new Blue trail, which will be called "Fluffy Bunny", adjacent to Kamikaze. Both Kamikaze and Fluffy Bunny will begin and end at the same place.


Friends of the Hydrocut

Spring Riding

The winter thaw brings muddy trails. In order to keep the trails fun for riding, please stay off of them when they are closed.

The trails are being checked frequently to determine when they are ready to be ridden. Some trails take longer to dry out than others. Trails that are wet (such as Dagmar, Creepy Corner, Stinky Girl, Frankenstein and The Bride) may remain closed while other trails in the network are open. This will allow riding to happen sooner, rather than waiting for all trails to be ready. Please respect the trail closures by only riding on trails that are open.



Construction work has commenced at the Waterloo Landfill Site, adjacent to the Hydrocut. The work is expected to be completed by October 2018. During the excavation phase, there may be some additional odour encountered, especially on trails adjacent to the construction. Please be mindful when riding on the Landfill side that construction equipment may be present, especially on weekdays.



There is no anticipated impact to the trail system as a result of this construction.
